# Change is coming to BAVH

June 30<sup>th</sup> sees the culmination of months of hard work on the annual Village Fete and Fun Dog Show. Our fete relies on the generosity of our residents – whether it be donations of unwanted goods at the doorknock or of their time before, during or after the event. This year, we've refurbished the kitchen and bar area, and repainted the inside of the hall. What is in a name, you ask? The idea behind this change – which will include an update to the charity's constitution – is to improve communication and reciprocal assistance between the many different community activities that exist in our villages, as well as ensuring the future of our hall.

Most organisations that rely on volunteers are, frankly, struggling. The time pressures of modern life mean that fewer people have time to help out. We hope that, by pooling resources and expertise we can foster a greater sense of community and ease the burden on the few people that dedicate a huge amount of their personal time to making sure that essential community activities are available.

The three remaining trustees – Alf Field, Hugh Griffiths and Helen Valvona – are delighted that Nick Richardson will be joining us from July as Treasurer. We're still looking for a Secretary and a Bookings Secretary.

The Bookings Secretary is a pivotal role for the future of the hall, without which we will be unable to take private hires going forward. These account for 50% of the hall's annual income and without the revenue generated over the last five years we would have been unable to contribute to the recent kitchen renovation project, the upcoming roof repairs and the planned floor refurbishment.

We've worked hard to streamline and simplify the bookings process, which Chris had already updated from a paper based system to a Google calendar and electronic booking forms during his tenure. In the future, we'd like to look into keyless entry to the hall and further automation of the bookings process.

#### Parish Council

After much pressure from the Parish Council and a healthy shove from Tricia Birchley we now have a beautiful surface through Mount Nugent, and well into Bellingdon. Also resurfaced is Bank Green, which has had little attention for decades.

We must continue to push for action in Asheridge—from the scout camp to Asheridge Farm is a disgrace especially the edges, with wider vehicles nibbling away at the verge creating huge wheel-damaging holes. Anyway, many thanks to TfB for what we have.

We've reduced the Precept as we feel our reserve is enough to cover our current obligations.

The speed post is currently facing Chesham and will soon go to Chartridge.

We've booked Chesham Town Council to do the grass verges again this year – first cut coming soon. Ideally we would like a farm-type machine to be used – this would do a better job on grass and could trim corners to keep maximum visibility.

#### Curvaceous Cook

#### One Pot Chicken

I first made this when scrabbling about in someone else's fridge for a quick supper for them when the shops had shut, and it worked out really well. We had it with rice, but mashed potato or even pasta would be good

- 6 chicken thighs for 3 or 4 people
- 1 red, 1 yellow and 1 orange pepper (they are sold in the supermarkets in these mixed bags) cut into chunks
- 1 red onion, sliced
- 1 tin of tomatoes
- 1 courgette into bite size chunks
- A little oil or a non-stick pan
- Heat oven to 180 degrees

Heat a large frying pan and brown the chicken on all sides. Remove to a casserole, or ideally, a large rustic dish.

Throw in the onion and gently fry till softening, then add the peppers and continue to cook for a few minutes. Add the courgette, and stir well, then mix with the chicken.

Empty the tin of tomatoes into the frying pan with half a tin of water or chicken stock, and bring to the boil.

Add black pepper, a little salt or chicken stock granules, a good shake of smoked paprika, ½ tsp sugar, and pour over the rest of the ingredients. I added some thyme, you could add whatever herbs you like.

Cook in the oven, turning the chicken over once, for about 25 minutes until the chicken is brown and well cooked.

The sauce will have thickened on its own. If we had had it, I would have added lots of fresh chopped parsley when serving. You could slip the chicken off the bones when serving, it should easily fall off and would be easier to eat on your knees, as we did.
