Remembering Alan Shepherd 1928-2021



Alan, who sadly passed away from pneumonia in Stoke Mandeville hospital on January 31st, lived in Bellingdon & Asheridge for over 40 years, first at Little Orchard, Bellingdon before moving, in 2015, to Widmore Close in Asheridge.

Following Acton Technical College Alan joined the De Havilland design office at Leavesden, going on to work on the design of helicopter engines.

A keen amateur pianist, he enjoyed Jazz, both listening to and playing, although he would not admit to any great expertise in the latter!

His other interests were both numerous and wide ranging, covering such diverse subjects as model aircraft manufacture and flying, motorbikes, table tennis, darts, real ale, metal and woodworking – he bought himself a combined metal lathe and milling machine which enabled a modest addition to his income. He was also a talented watercolour artist and, having attended a course, became a skilled furniture restorer.

He will be remembered especially for his dry wit which he never lost, despite the many illnesses inflicted on him in his later years, and the stoicism with which he bore these ills, although his biggest regret was having to give up his driving licence, "after all" he would say "I don't fall over when I'm sat down"!

# Are you getting enough fibre (broadband)?

Nobody could have predicted how important a decent internet connection would become over the last year – for work, school, exercise and more, its been an essential part of our lives.

Unfortunately not everyone can access the internet reliably and several schemes are underway locally to upgrade the infrastructure to enable faster speeds and better connections.

In essence this should allow simultaneous video calls and none of that "you've frozen" or "your internet connection is unstable" that's plagued many households. After all who wants to drop out of the village quiz at the critical time?

Some of Bellingdon designated "urban" (by who we're not quite sure) are already eligible to receive an upgrade but the "rural" areas have to apply for funding under the Rural Gigabit Voucher Scheme.

"Rural" Bellingdon (inc Bank Green) and Asheridge are running projects to upgrade the infrastructure. The sign-up portal for the Bellingdon "Two Gates Lane" project is now live: <u>https://</u> <u>www.openreach.com/connectmycommunity</u>

Businesses (including sole traders/self employed) can receive a double value voucher, so please sign up as a business if you can.

The funding is disappearing very soon (end of March) so please do sign up asap.

# Heard it on The New Grapevine...

From photos of our beautiful locality to finding a recommended tradesperson or even a missing dementia patient, **The New Grapevine** offers a wide spectrum of information and advice pertinent to local needs. Whilst no longer unique I'm willing to bet that few areas were served by such a service before ours.

Developed as an adjunct to The Hilltop News – the local newsletter serving the villages of Hawridge, Cholesbury, Buckland Common and St Leonard's, the New Grapevine serves as an information and advice exchange.

New Grapevine is strictly a social service without commercial overtones. To prevent it becoming an advertisement board for local businesses and private sales, thus diluting the value of the content is was set up to provide, such postings are discouraged and gentle reminders posted following transgression of these rules. Persistent offenders have their future postings moderated to filter out unwelcome messages. Otherwise, postings are not previewed by anybody.

Whilst active comment and discussion is allowed – a great way to engage with your community, proving especially useful during lockdowns, Grapevine allows no discussion that may lead to dispute or acrimony. Obviously content has to be moderated and to this end the anonymity of the administration is necessary. Solicitations for sale of goods and employment are not welcome. Children's work experience and solicitations for the activities of only charities that have a relevance to the Hilltop community are welcome. For the avoidance of doubt, welcome charities are limited to the local school, the village and parish halls, local societies and preservation groups, the hilltop churches and nearby hospices.

Over more recent years, the admin have seen the benefits of widening its coverage to include slightly more outlying areas including Bellingdon with Asheridge, Hastoe, Chivery and Wiggington. Villages to the south now have their own version of Grapevine – The Lee Forum – and more widely useful postings are often reposted on each other's site.

Postings to the broader New Grapevine community must be made to <u>news@newgrapevine.co.uk</u> only. Communications with its administrators can be sent to <u>new.grapevine@gmx.com</u> making sure to address the administrators in the body of the text, so the message does not simply get bounced back on to the broader New Grapevine because it was mistaken for a misdirected general posting. If you are not sure whether a posting would be welcome, you are encouraged to confirm it with the administrators before posting it to the full membership. Whoever the originator and admin are, we should be grateful to them for such a foresighted and useful public service.
