Local Business Profile : SugarPlumFairy Cakes

Sue Bourne and Eanne Russell's interest in cakes started in 2008 when Eanne ordered cakes for her twins' birthday. They dissected the fairy castle cake and pirate treasure chest and decided they could do the same with a bit of practice.

That insight, combined with their passion for cake, chocolate and things that looked good enough to eat, led to them participating in various courses to gain experience with as many cake decorating techniques as they could master. They shared their delicious masterpieces with friends, families and work colleagues.

Eanne and Sue formally started SugarPlum Fairy Cakes In 2010, when people suggested their cakes were good enough to sell. They registered with the council, attended the required Health and Hygiene course and a new local business was born.

They have done cakes in all shapes and sizes from

horses, tractors, a hot air balloon, fairies, cars and a judo suit. Their wedding cakes have travelled as far as Ireland. They have donated cakes for local charities such as to the Jaguar Garage in aid of the Scanappeal, to Sargent & Plester Dance School and of course to the village hall fund-raising events.

Sugarplum Fairycake also run workshops for people who want to learn about cupcake and cookie decoration.

Curvaceous Cook: Summer Fruit Salad



As the wind blows and the rain rains and the power goes off and on, it is hard to imagine that when you read this the British strawberry season will be upon us! But it will be - so here is an idea for really getting the best from this wonderful summer fruit.

INGREDIENTS

- 400g strawberries, halved or quartered if large, to make an easy mouthful
- 150g raspberries
- Finely grated zest of 1 lemon
- ¹/₂ deseeded vanilla pod
- 40g icing sugar.

Start this the day before to get the absolute best flavour, but even a couple of hours will make a difference.

In a bowl, tip out all the ingredients. Cover with cling film and refrigerate for 24 hours.

When ready to serve, arrange on the plate and add a few Greek basil (the tiny leaved ones) leaves.

This is really good on its own, to decorate a lemon tart, or in a Victoria sandwich with some fresh cream. You could also fold it into equal quantities of Greek yoghurt and whipped cream with some broken meringues or Amaretti biscuits, but only add the fruit at the last minute before serving.
